The spiritual symbolism of Jesus' appearances on Easter Sunday Part 2 of 2

Third Appearance



It is believed that Jesus appeared to Peter next, though much is unknown about this first visit. It's possible that Jesus appeared to Peter as he was returning from the tomb by a different route. The *Golden Legend*

explains how in this instance, "The name 'Peter' is interpreted as meaning 'obedient,' and Peter here represents the obedient, to whom the Lord appears."

This is of course the enduring obedience of Peter, despite his initial denial the night Jesus was sentenced to death.

Fourth Appearance



Then Jesus appeared to the disciples on the road to Emmaus and was revealed to them in the breaking of the bread.

The *Golden Legend* reflects how Emmaus, "is interpreted 'desire for

counsel' and signifies Christ's poor, who wish to fulfill this counsel: 'Go, sell what you have and give to the poor.'"

Fifth Appearance



Last of all Jesus appears to his apostles gathered together in a closed room, except for Thomas. "Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, 'Peace to you.'" (Luke 24:36)

The Golden Legend writes

how the apostles "represent the religious" of the Church, who are enclosed within a cloister and contemplate the wounds of the resurrected Jesus.

*Golden Legend is a collection of hagiographies by Blessed Jacobus de Varagine that was widely read in late medieval Europe. More than a thousand manuscripts of the text have survived. It was likely compiled around the year 1260, although the text was added to over the centuries.
