### Why Sunday Mass?

## Why do I have to go to Mass on Sunday?

For generations children have asked their parents this question. Today, many

adults ask it too. It is an old and a new question at the same time, for though Mass remains the same, Sunday has changed.

In 1954, about 80% of Catholics attended Sunday Mass regularly. They included most young people. Now, fewer than 20% do, and numbers are still declining. In many parishes (churches), there are few young people going to church. The young people who go to Church are a MINORITY. They stand out among their peers.

The decline also affected other Christian churches. At the same time, the Canadian Sunday has changed. It has become secularized. Back then, very few people worked on Sunday. There were no hockey competitions, no football, no skiing, perhaps no television, few movies. It was harder to visit friends because fewer people had cars, and there were little public transport.

Churches were then one of the few places where people could meet on Sundays. Churches before sponsored church activities, sports activities, even organized dances and picnics. Therefore, people go to Church TO PRAY, and at the same time TO MEET with members of the community.

COMPARE that with today. Many people work on SUNDAYS. For others, Sunday is the only day they can sleep in, and do the shopping. Today, going to Church competes with FOOTBALL, HOCKEY, SKIING, MOVIES, TELEVISION, COMPUTER GAMES, SCHOOL ACTIVITIES, AND FAMILY OUTINGS.

In 1954, too, community was easier to find. People were joiners. People liked to do things with others, and joined community groups. Now, community groups struggle for members. This reflects a more individualist society. People have more choices, and they emphasize their individual right to choose for themselves. They still look for connection, but ON THEIR OWN TERMS, and not in established groups.

Today, those who attend Sunday Mass regularly stand out from the majority of Catholics. They make a decision to go to Mass, choosing it over many other attractive things they could be doing.


#### **BOOK of REMEMBRANCE 2020**
