The Ascension of the Lord

Prayer and Evangelization "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth." This is the great commission that continues to echo throughout the centuries. All of us, especially stewards, are called to be witnesses of the Gospel and evangelize the hearts of those nearest to us. However, before we can convert others, we need to have an interior conversion ourselves. St. Vincent Ferrer says that, "If you truly want to help the soul of your neighbor, you should approach God first with all your heart. Ask him simply to fill you with charity, the greatest of all virtues; with it you can accomplish what you desire." Before we can do any great deeds for Christ and the Church, we need to be sufficiently nourished by the love and grace of God. This can only come about through our dedication to prayer. We must pray for the strength to love and share the Gospel with others. One practice we can adopt is the morning offering. This involves beginning each day, perhaps even while still lying in bed, with a prayer to God thanking Him for another morning and asking Him to help us offer our day for the good of the Gospel. We can supplement this by beginning any period of formal ministry with an opening prayer. We need to always remember that it is the Holy Spirit working through us that is bringing about great graces. Let us strive to infuse our stewardship with the power of prayer.

History of the Ascension of Our Lord

The reality of Christ's Ascension is so important that the creeds (the basic statements of belief) of Christianity all affirm, in the words of the Apostles' Creed, that "He ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of <u>God the Father</u> almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead." The denial of the Ascension is as grave a departure from Christian teaching as is the denial of Christ's Resurrection.

Christ's bodily Ascension foreshadows our own entrance into Heaven not simply as souls, after our death, but as glorified bodies, after the resurrection of the dead at the Final Judgment. In redeeming mankind, Christ not only offered salvation to our souls but began the restoration of the material world itself to the glory that God intended before Adam's fall.

The Feast of the Ascension marks the beginning of the first <u>novena</u> or nine days of prayer. Before His Ascension, Christ promised to send the Holy Spirit to His apostles. Their prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit, which began on Ascension Thursday, ended with the descent of the Holy Spirit on <u>Pentecost Sunday</u>, ten days later.

Today, Catholics recall that first novena by praying the Novena to the Holy Ghost between Ascension and Pentecost, asking for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Loving God,

often giving into temptation and weakness, we forget that You alone are God. Help us to avoid greed in all its forms, seeking satisfaction from things that are passing and being indifferent to the cries of those who suffer pain. May we allow the Gospel to teach us that all human life is sacred, that everyone has a right to a place in Your world and that the desire for peace resides in every vulnerable human heart. We offer You, Most High and Glorious God, the pain of our war-torn and hurting world and entrust to Your care those who have lost their lives, those who grieve for them and those who have to leave their homes to be safe. Inspire those with power to see that violence is not the path to peace and to pursue resolutions to conflicts that respect human dignity. Loving God, hear all of our prayers and those in hearts throughout the world through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Jesus gave us special promises prior to His departure for Heaven. He went up to be with God the Father, but He will return someday. We can await that, but can also spread His love to others around us.
