

### **Sunday Gospel Reflection**

Easter Sunday

Gospel: John 20.1-18++ - The Resurrection of Jesus

#### Recognizing the Risen Lord

Rejoice, the Lord is risen, truly He is risen! Today is the Solemnity of Solemnities, the most holy day in the Church's calendar. Let us take a moment to rejoice in the glory of the resurrection. These past forty days we've been preparing for this great feast where we will be met with the risen Christ. However, let us ask ourselves, how often do we fail to recognize Him in our daily lives?

In the Gospel today, we hear the account of Jesus appearing to Mary Magdalene. Mary is face-toface with Jesus risen from the dead and yet she didn't recognize Him. She has spent the last couple years of her life following Him and now she cannot even identify Him as the man before her. While we may be quick to judge Mary, we should remember that Christ makes Himself present to us in countless ways that we often don't perceive.

One way that Jesus comes to us is through our neighbour. St. Teresa of Calcutta says "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus, I must feed him. This is sick Jesus. This one has leprosy or gangrene; I must wash him and tend to him. I serve because I love Jesus." This Easter, let us rejoice in Jesus' resurrection and seek to find Him in our neighbours. The same way that we would run to serve Christ, let us serve Christ dwelling in those around us and fully live out our call of stewardship.

#### Summary

These past forty days we've been preparing for this great feast where we will be met with the risen Christ yet how often do we fail to recognize Him in our daily lives? St. Teresa of Calcutta believes that we encounter Jesus through our neighbour as she says "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus, I must feed him." #### Holy Cross Church Restoration Project Spring 2024

In prepration for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Parish

#### **Important Notice**

As planned, our Restoration Project is set to start next month, with the re-painting of the interior of the church, re-carpeting, followed by ventilation and air-conditioning, and the repositioning of the Tabernacle from the north side of the church to the center of the sanctuary, and cleaning of the Mosaic walls.

Painting-Altar & main worship; all walls, ceilings, beams, trims and baseboards. Front entrance hallway. Side entrance hallway & stairwell to basement level. Room leading into the side hallway & room across from the altar. All stain doors will be lightly sanded and clear coat with polyurethane.

Re-carpeting-uninstalling church seats & reinstalling after carpet replacement. Removal & disposal of existing carpet. Removal of 250 linear feet of shoe molds on baseboards. Reinstalling new MDF shoe molds on baseboards. Installing new commercial grade carpet.

Air-conditioning

Reposition of Tabernacle.

The painting and re-carpeting is scheduled to commence on <u>April 2</u>, and is estimated to be completed by <u>July 31</u>, <u>2024 (hopefully)</u>. During this period, the church will remain closed for re-painting / re-carpeting purposes. <u>Starting Apr 2</u>, <u>Tuesday - regular mass services will be held at the basement hall. The front door will be closed for the time being and until further notice. <u>2</u> entrances going to the church; side door (Cosburn) & side door (Donlands) going to the garden.</u>

We appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we work towards creating a better & comfortable environment, beautiful church for all of us. We will continue to share regular status updates. Thank you for your support during this restoration process. You can donate by either cash/cheque or you can donate online through Holy Cross Parish website. Thank you very much for your support and may the grace of the almighty be with each one of us as we undertake this transformative endeavor.

Easter Message 2024

We greet you all a blessed EASTER! WE rejoice with the whole of humanity and all creation in the Risen Lord who is HOPE!

St Augustine wrote: "And He departed from our sight that we might return to our hearts and there find Him. For he departed and behold, He is here!"

Easter is the affirmation and celebration that Jesus has been raised from the dead. Easter confirms that the resurrection of Jesus is also our rising to new life. Jesus is our resurrection.

The resurrection is not a return to human earthly life, a life still subject to evil and destruction. The life that the Risen Christ now possesses is God's very life. That is why He will not die again. Sin has no more power over him. In Jesus the Risen One, we are assured that God was, is and will be victorious over sinfulness, viciousness, wickednes, corruption and violence.

Let us then embrace/start a new beginning, another chance, and fresh opportunities. Our lives are now full of hope, full of meaning and love. Yes, God is with us. His grace is upon us.

Let us accept the invitation of Easter: to live a life of hope, of fidelity to God, and a total commitment to His divine plan. Let us together walk the way of Jesus, and leave behind the darkness of grief and doubts.

Let us then reflect and find hope, meaning and inspiration from St. Paul in his letter to the Romans: "By this Baptism in His cross, we were buried with Christ and as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we begin walking in a new life. It was an image of His death when we are grafted in Him, and so we will also share in His Resurrection."
