Sunday Gospel Reflection

Palm (Passion) Sunday Gospel: Lk 22.14 – 23.56 – The Passion of the Lord

The Cross of Christ

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most important and solemn week of the Church's liturgical calendar. In the Gospel this Sunday we are invited to reflect on the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. The cross is the most recognizable symbol of our Christian faith. We see crucifixes hanging in Churches, schools, homes and even worn around many people's necks. However, we can become so used to this constant presence of the crucifix that we become indifferent to what it signifies. Let us take a moment to grasp the beauty and truth found in the cross.

God became man and was willing to be crucified for the forgiveness of our sins. It is through the cross that Christ defeats Satan and triumphantly attains our salvation, allowing us to enter our heavenly home. The entire course of human history was dramatically altered because of the cross of Christ. As stewards, we should always view the salvation won through the cross as the greatest gift that God has bestowed on us.

As we approach the Holy Triduum, let us take some time each day this week to reflect on the passion of Christ. Many great saints strongly promoted this practice of calling to mind the sufferings of Christ. We can do this in many ways such as praying the Stations of the Cross or the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary, reading the passion narratives in the Bible or simply gazing upon a crucifix. Let us never fail to appreciate the sublime

On Saturday, May 31 of 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a new archdiocesan event called "A Day with Mary" will be taking place at <u>Villanova College located at</u> <u>2480 15th Sideroad in King City.</u>

The day will take place outdoors, on the artificial turf field at the school. Some children's programming and catechesis will take place inside the school. Washrooms are available inside the school and at field level for those with limited mobility.

<u>Please note</u>: A Day with Mary will be held rain or shine, please plan according to the weather. In case of severe rain or thundershowers, the event will move inside the school.

King City is located between Highways 400 and 404, North of Vaughan. Villanova college is easily accessible, and the nearest intersection is that of Keele Street and 15th Sideroad.

Parking and Transportation

Parking is free at Villanova College. However, it is very limited. For those arriving by car, you are encouraged to arrive early, and the parking staff will assist in directing you to designated parking lots. Parishes, religious communities, lay associations and ecclesial movements bringing groups of any size are encouraged to book buses for transportation or arrange for car-pooling. Parking attendants will be on hand to direct automobiles to designated parking lots and buses to loading/unloading zones and will direct you to the designated bus parking location
